### Instructions:



- Colour and decorate the bookmark adding the word HAPPINESS to it.
- Cut out the bookmark and glue it to stiff cardboard then punch a small hole through the top. Thread a piece of string or ribbon through the hole.
- Colour all the hearts the colour of St-Patrick's day. You can also add designs and textures.
- Cut out the 8 hearts and the square.
- Glue the tips of the first four hearts to one side of the square. Then flip the square over and glue the ends of the ribbon onto the square.
- Fold the remaining four hearts in half lengthwise to make a crease. Glue the left-hand side of each heart onto the back of the square (overtop of the ribbon).
